
CCL Reviewed Construction Company's Claim Wichita Airport - Renovation & Expansion Wichita, Kansas

CCL was retained by the Wichita Airport Authority to review Hardaway Construction, Inc.'s claim, and assist in its negotiation and resolution, on the reconstruction of Taxiway D at the Wichita Airport. CCL reviewed the Hardaway



claim, evaluated Hardaway's construction schedule, and reviewed Wilson & Company's, the Airport Authority's engineer, administration of the change orders and time extension requests. CCL also met with Hardaway to clarify a variety of ambiguities in their claim.

In order to renovate and expand runway and taxiways, the designer, Wilson & Company, limited construction work to two windows, a 30 day window for Runway 1L19R and a 75 day window for Taxiway D. Hardaway Construction Company, the General Contractor, was unable to complete either the runway or the taxiway work within either of the windows. Hardaway claimed its failure on weather, design changes, design errors, and other factors beyond Hardaway's control.

Hardaway's work included construction of taxiways, installation of lighting systems and associated work including asphalt base, concrete paving and drainage piping. CCL evaluated Hardaway's claim that included job site overhead, idle and extended owned equipment charges, idle leased equipment charges, and home office overhead.

CCL provided an oral report to Wichita Airport Authority and their outside legal counsel, Stinson Mag & Fizzell, regarding CCL's findings. The Authority met with Hardaway and successfully negotiated a resolution of the claim.



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
